Lisa R. Stafford, an NCTAE retired theatre arts teacher, is currently a freelance Equity stage manager based in New York City. Lisa received her B.A. in theatre arts from Catawba College and her Masters in Theatre Education from UNC-Greensboro. Lisa taught high school theatre in North Carolina for almost 23 years, retiring from Sun Valley High School in Union County in 2016. During her teaching career, she was an original member of the North Carolina Theatre Arts Educators. Lisa also worked as the Managing Director/Production Stage Manager/Costume Designer for the Union County Performance Ensemble for 13 years, working on shows such as The Phantom of the Opera, Shrek the Musical, Disney's Beauty and the Beast, and Ragtime.

After moving in New York in October 2016, Lisa has stage managed many productions or readings of new works. These works include the developmental production of Allen Knee's (*Broadway's Little Women, The Man Who Was Peter Pan* which became the movie and later Broadway's *Finding Neverland*) *The Astonishing Times of Timothy Cratchit*. This musical had its U.K. premiere in 2019. In January 2018, she made her Off Broadway debut as the Production Stage Manager for the new play, *The Chekhov Dreams*. Other memorable productions include a reading of the new play *Up and Down* with Isabella Rossellini and Robert Creighton (*Broadway's Frozen, Lion King*) and *Maverick* with Tony Award winning producer David Elliott (*Vanya, Sonia, Masha and Spike*).

Lisa has also served as a production assistant and is now the Production Coordinator for the Broadway Stage Management Symposium, founded by Broadway Stage Manager Matthew Aaron Stern. Between shows, Lisa works as a production assistant for events such as the International Emmy Awards and the *Into the Woods* benefit concert at Town Hall.

Since returning to in person theatrical work in 2021, Lisa has worked primarily on musicals like *I Love You*, You're Perfect, Now Change; Rock of Ages, South Pacific, Matilda the Musical and the reimagined Almost Heaven: John Denver's America in regional theatres on the East Coast. In December 2021, she had the opportunity to stage manage a developmental workshop of Oedipus with Deaf West Theatre. Lisa is currently in rehearsals for Berta, Berta at Mile Square Theatre in New Jersey with North Carolina native Kevin R. Free as the director.
